Calendar changes reviewed:

High Schools are not aware of the Computer Information Program, but they prepare students to move into Multi Media. Stan Weiss is very interested in getting more information from high schools in the area.

Organizational Restructuring:

We have been pulled away from the Business Administration even though we are business focused. We are a business solution program. We do cross over with other programs that we will be with, focus will be on Technology & E-Commerce. Another centre called Technology & Trades is now changing to just Technology. There is a new building, but we might prefer to be in the TEC building with other programs in our new centre.
