At the previous meeting a plan was presented to "right-size" the curriculum in the interest of being cost-

effective. However, the current curriculum is good it was proposed that we leave the design as it is for the next year or two. With games programming on campus, hopefully CIT numbers will increase. This year, the first year student numbers are 40 and there are 8 students confirmed for January. Overall, program numbers may be down but the program is hoping they will go up.
